AS WE GATHER

Sunday, “the eighth day of the week,” is celebrated by Christians as the first day of the eternal life into which they were baptized. Today, the beginning of the great and Holy Week of Lent, we begin with the note of great joy as the crowds receive Jesus entering Jerusalem. This will be the last time He comes to the holy city. For we then follow Him to the judgment hall, the cross of suffering, and the fearful tomb of death. The penitential season of Lent concludes with the three holy days, the Triduum of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Let us follow our Lord as He takes our sins upon Himself, that we may receive His new life in the forgiveness of our sins and the joy of the resurrection.

HOLY GOSPEL: Mark 15:1-47 *(The Passion of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ)*

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the fifteenth chapter.

People: Glory to you, O Lord.

Congregation reads together:

15:1 And as soon as it was morning, the chief priests held a consultation with the elders and scribes and the whole council. And they bound Jesus and led Him away and delivered Him over to Pilate. **2** And Pilate asked Him, "Are you the King of the Jews?" And He answered him, "You have said so." **3** And the chief priests accused Him of many things. **4** And Pilate again asked Him, "Have you no answer to make? See how many charges they bring against You." **5** But Jesus made no further answer, so that Pilate was amazed.

6 Now at the feast he used to release for them one prisoner for whom they asked. **7** And among the rebels in prison, who had committed murder in the insurrection, there was a man called Barabbas. **8** And the crowd came up and began to ask Pilate to do as he usually did for them. **9** And he answered them, saying, "Do you want me to release for you the King of the Jews?" **10** For he perceived that it was out of envy that the chief priests had delivered Him up. **11** But the chief priests stirred up the crowd to have him release for them Barabbas instead. **12** And Pilate again said to them, "Then what shall I do with the man you call the King of the Jews?" **13** And they cried out again, "Crucify Him." **14** And Pilate said to them, "Why, what evil has He done?" But they shouted all the more, "Crucify Him." **15** So Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released for them Barabbas, and having scourged Jesus, he delivered Him to be crucified.

16 And the soldiers led Him away inside the palace (that is, the governor's headquarters), and they called together the whole battalion. **17** And they clothed Him in a purple cloak, and twisting together a crown of thorns, they put it on Him. **18** And they began to salute Him, "Hail, King of the Jews!" **19** And they were striking His head with a reed and spitting on Him and kneeling down in homage to Him. **20** And when they had mocked Him, they stripped Him of the purple cloak and put His own clothes on Him. And they led Him out to crucify Him.

21 And they compelled a passerby, Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, the father of Alexander and Rufus, to carry His cross. **22** And they brought Him to the place called Golgotha (which means Place of a Skull). **23** And they offered Him wine mixed with myrrh, but He did not take it. **24** And they crucified Him and divided His garments among them, casting lots for them, to decide what each should take. **25** And it was the third hour when they crucified Him. **26** And the inscription of the charge against Him read, "The King of the Jews." **27** And with Him they crucified two robbers, one on His right and one on His left. **29** And those who passed by derided Him, wagging their heads and saying, "Aha! You who would destroy the temple and rebuild it in three days, **30** save Yourself, and come down from the cross!" **31** So also the chief priests with the scribes mocked Him to one another, saying, "He saved others; He cannot save Himself. **32** Let the Christ, the King of Israel, come down now from the cross that we may see and believe." Those who were crucified with Him also reviled Him.

³³ And when the sixth hour had come, there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour. ³⁴ And at the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, “Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?” which means, “My God, my God, why have You forsaken Me?” ³⁵ And some of the bystanders hearing it said, “Behold, He is calling Elijah.” ³⁶ And someone ran and filled a sponge with sour wine, put it on a reed and gave it to Him to drink, saying, “Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to take Him down.” ³⁷ And Jesus uttered a loud cry and breathed His last. ³⁸ And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom. ³⁹ And when the centurion, who stood facing Him, saw that in this way He breathed His last, he said, “Truly this man was the Son of God!”

⁴⁰ There were also women looking on from a distance, among whom were Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James the younger and of Joses, and Salome. ⁴¹ When He was in Galilee, they followed Him and ministered to Him, and there were also many other women who came up with Him to Jerusalem.

⁴² And when evening had come, since it was the day of Preparation, that is, the day before the Sabbath, ⁴³ Joseph of Arimathea, a respected member of the council, who was also himself looking for the kingdom of God, took courage and went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. ⁴⁴ Pilate was surprised to hear that He should have already died. And summoning the centurion, he asked him whether He was already dead. ⁴⁵ And when he learned from the centurion that He was dead, he granted the corpse to Joseph. ⁴⁶ And Joseph bought a linen shroud, and taking Him down, wrapped Him in the linen shroud and laid Him in a tomb that had been cut out of the rock. And he rolled a stone against the entrance of the tomb. ⁴⁷ Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joses saw where He was laid.

LENTEN WORSHIP SERIES – **Maundy Thursday:** Jesus invites us to join Him once again at the Table. He repeats the invitation again and again because He feeds us in order to build us up and strengthen our faith. His invitation draws us into a place where we have fellowship with all believers. And yet, our fellowship is stained by sin: “Truly, I say to you, one of you will betray Me, one who is eating with Me” (Mark 14:18). We are not asked to root out the offender, not commanded to judge one another. That is God’s task, not ours. Instead, Jesus gives us His own body and blood, and with it a promise: “This is My blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many” (Mark 14:24). His invitation to return is accompanied by His promise to make all things new, when once again we will share the fruit of the vine with Christ Himself. **Good Friday:** The author of creation hangs on the cross, wracked with pain and writhing in agony. It is almost unbearable to look on this scene, and yet without it we would be lost forever, still trapped in our sins. As we gather together on Good Friday to remember the sacrifice that Jesus Christ made for each of us, may we focus on the One who is the way and the truth and the life, even Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. © 2020 Concordia Publishing House.
