Dear Saints of Ascension,

This Fall I taught a class on Death and Dying. I didn't plan it this way, but that class ended just one week before All Saints Day. Both my preparation for that Bible Class and the service on All Saints Day have been on my mind. Death has a way of clearing out the cobwebs in someone's life. It brings to the forefront of your mind questions that we often want to ignore. The thought of death causes us to think about what is really important. So, what is important?

The church, its pastors, and its people can get distracted just like anyone else. As a pastor when I am caring for families and friends who have just lost their wife, husband, mom, dad, or friend the real purpose of the Church comes out in the most beautiful way. It reminds me what is important. Faith in Jesus as the Son of God, who became true man, died on the cross and rose from the dead to save you. That is the important thing. 

### Christian Ed's Quarterly Book Recommendation



### Bondage of the Will By Martin Luther

Four years after the Protestant Reformation began and in answer to Erasmus' Diatribe on Free Will, Luther wrote this book in order to assert that the human will is enslaved to sin and lacks free will in matters of salvation.

### Key teachings:

- · <u>Bondage of the will:</u> Because of the fall of Adam, human beings are inherently sinful and have no ability to choose God or do good works of their own will.
- · <u>Salvation is through faith alone:</u> Salvation is not earned through good works or human effort but is a gift from God, received by faith.
- · <u>God's sovereign grace:</u> God is the sole actor in salvation, initiating and completing all that is necessary for a person to be redeemed.
- · <u>Denial of free will in salvation:</u> The idea of free will in the context of spiritual matters is an illusion, as the will is not free to choose the good.

This book will help you clarify the difficult but biblical position on human will and will make you more conversant in it. It is especially helpful when engaging with Roman Catholics or decision-theology Protestants, both of whom assign more freedom to the human will than scripture properly allows.

### **Christian Ed Updates**

Fall is in full swing here at Ascension Lutheran Church. We were excited to start the season with Rally Day which was held on Sept. 7th. We just started up our New Member Class & a book of the bible study on Titus. Feel free to drop in!

### **Outreach Team Updates**

The PUMPKIN FEST/FLEA MARKET XI (if Superbowl can use Roman numerals, so can we) was another smash hit--pardon the pun, we didn't smash any pumpkins. Income for Pumpkin Fest was \$3,155 resulting in a profit of \$2660. A 10% tithe of \$315 is given to the church general fund and the remainder is set aside for a future special project. We only had two Thrivent grants of 250 dollars each compared to having three last year so that did infringe a bit on profit amount. We had 155 pies to sell and got many compliments for each type. Only a few pies are in the freezer (keep watching for sale of them closer to Thanksgiving.) Thank you to the 41 volunteers who gave many hours and to all those who attended and made lots of yummy, fun, useful purchases. Please support Shenot's Farm Market, Chili's on McKnight Rd, and Mazur's Greenhouse & Farm, who very much contributed to our success. With this event we truly reach out to the community.

The speaker in September on Diabetes & Heart Health Nutrition was one of the best we've offered. We were pleased with the attendance & what we learned!

Thank you to all who contributed items for the October Shepherd's Heart clothing drive. We delivered 29 coats, 87 pairs of socks, 44 T-shirts, 12 sweatshirts, and various scarves, flannel shirts, briefs, boxers, shoes, dress shirts, pants, and even thermal underwear. They are always so thankful of what we do for them!




